
Good news! From hospitals, clinics and nursing schools like these, a modern country-wide Christian medical network is officially underway.

Christian mission hospitals, clinics and nursing schools built in the past 100+ years in Malawi are looking at an uncertain future. The gap between the medical needs of their communities and their ability to serve those needs is growing wider year after year.

The church and medical leaders in Malawi have embarked on a plan to create a network supported and enabled by MBF and a group of six medical mission organizations. The vision is to to create a Christian medical network that is ready for the 21st century.

Readiness will mean upgraded and expanded facilities and equipment; medical staff trained in surgery, specialty medicine, and spiritual ministry; additional nurses and vastly improved clinical practices; and updated operational and business systems.

The planned transformation of people, places and programs is extensive and will grow and develop over the next 5-10 years.

By acting now to bring medical missions in Malawi and other countries into the 21st century, we ensure the sick and wounded who otherwise have no hope will receive more sustainable access to the medical care they need and exposure to the Gospel of Christ.
